PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS



The 2022-23 Financial Year has been an important year for Singapore Squash as we made a large push into garnering more attention for the sport of Squash locally, as well as continued efforts to improve our High-Performance programme to shape the future stars of Singapore Squash in years to come. These could not have been possible without our local squash community's consistent participation throughout the year and support for our vision of Singapore Squash.

Our biggest addition to the Singapore Squash calendar was the staging of the MARIGOLD Singapore Squash Open 2022, the first Professional Squash Association (PSA) Gold-level event for the South-East Asian region. The

stars of the Squash World converged in Singapore from the 15th to the 20th of November 2022, with England's Mohamed ElShorbagy and New Zealand's Joelle King emerging as champions. Local athletes Samuel Kang, Au Yeong Wai Yhann, and Lee Zi Fang had the opportunity to pit themselves against the very best and gain invaluable experience that we believe can only benefit them as they continue their growth.

Our other major event of the year was the Squash Ball, which was delayed for some time due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We finally managed to have it and we are delighted with the way it turned out. Once again, we'd like to thank all of you for the support of the event, which has raised funds for the High Performance activities of our athletes.

Locally, we saw familiar faces top the field to be 2023 National Champions with Samuel Kang and Au Yeong Wai Yhann both continuing their winning streak to win their sixth consecutive National Championship. Ong Zhe Sim also won back-to-back Girls' Under-19 and Under-17 National Titles, with Samuel Lau scoring his maiden Boys' Under-19 National Championship. We also held our yearly Circuit and Junior Circuit events that saw participation from our passionate squash community, from juniors to masters.

The National Squash League (NSL), which has been on hold, also made its return in 2022, albeit a much shorter season. A total of 24 clubs and 700 unique participants were part of this year's edition and we look forward to even more in the coming year.

We must thank our key donors, MARIGOLD and ONCOCARE, who continues to support the local activities of SSRA. It is thorough their contributions, together with our other supporters, that SSRA can do this much.

Our continued effort to broaden Squash's reach continued with community events like the Open House and World Squash Day events, as well as mini and interactive versions of squash at the MARIGOLD Singapore Squash Open 2022 Fan Zone to introduce squash to the public. We plan on widening our reach to more Singaporean youth in the hopes of introducing fresh faces into the community and identifying more young talents.

The High-Performance programme has continued to represent Singapore in major competitions this past year, with our team competing in the World Doubles Championships, Asian Team Championships, Asian Junior Individual & Team Championships, and the SEA Cup where we swept the Gold Medals in all the Jumbo Doubles categories.

The upcoming year will see the second Edition of the PSA Singapore Squash Open 2023 and the return of Squash to the Pesta Sukan lineup. The NSL 2023 season will see a longer season stretching from

April to October in an effort to promote participation in the local community for a more consistent period.

From the governance side of things, we will also be ramping up efforts to complete our new constitution in the coming year, to be in line with the SportSG and Singapore National Olympic Council (SNOC) Model Constitution. This is part of the initiative for all National Sports Association (NSA) to be adopting a similar version.

With international travel restrictions continuing to ease up, we plan to stage more international events like MARIGOLD PSA Satellites and the annual ONCOCARE Singapore Junior Open to welcome overseas athletes to boost our local tournament scene while also giving our national athletes more experience at overseas competitions. With the Asian Games to be held this year in Hangzhou, China, we hope to secure a respectable finish as we continue to work towards bringing Singapore Squash to even greater heights.



THE YEAR AHEAD

Major Event

Singapore Squash Open 2023

The second edition of the Singapore Squash Open will take place once again in November 2023. After a successful inaugural event, which saw top notch world-class squash played on our shores, we will look forward to an even better event as part of our 3-year hosting contract with the Professional Squash Association (PSA). The PSA World Tour Gold Event is set to attract the world's top 20 men and women to compete for a minimum prize of USD 110,000 per gender.

Fundraising

With the matching grant of the One Team Singapore Fund (OTSF) once again extended to \$400,000 in this financial year, we will once again reach out to potential donors, leveraging on the network of our Management Committee members and the greater squash community. With the Singapore Squash Open.

High Performance

The focus of the coming financial year on High Performance will be the 2022 Asian Games in Hangzhou. Our men's team, who finished joint-5th in the last Asian Games in 2018, will be joining their TeamSG athletes at this Major Game.

In preparation of future Major Games such as the Asian and Commonwealth Games in 2026, SEA Games 2027 and 2029, the OTSF funds will allow us to invest in further high performance activities leading to them.

To achieve our goals, the funding will be used to fund and/or subsidise TeamSG athletes to overseas training and competitions such as the Asian Individual (Senior and Junior) Championships, Asian Team (Senior and Junior) Championships and various Asian Junior Super Series events. We will also be striving to give our players greater exposure on PSA events both locally and internationally, through Wildcard opportunities at the Singapore Squash Open and locally organised PSA Satellites.

From the High Performance staffing side, we hope to attract better coaching talent to serve the needs of our national training squad, whom we will seek to expand in numbers.

We are also identifying athletes eligible for SPEX Carding and Scholarships, where they will receive greater support from SportSG in training and competing in international competitions.

Local Events and Programmes

In the upcoming year, we are looking to resume the National Squash League (NSL) as well as more local tournaments as Covid-19 restrictions are gradually relaxed. Our local tournaments will be looking to include more novice and master's events to engage a greater community.

We are also expanding our grassroots development programmes through Mini Squash and other school outreach programmes. We are also investing into embracing technology and exploring how we can make squash more inclusive for everyone.

Strengthening of Secretariat Workforce

With local restrictions fully opened now and the nearly complete opening of borders, both our local activities and international events are set to be back in full force. Coupled with our desire to close out some gaps to improve on our governance, SSRA will also be strengthening the Secretariat workforce.

GOVERNANCE

Role of the Management Committee

The Management Committee's role is to provide strategic direction and oversight of SSRA's programmes and objectives and to steer the charity towards fulfilling its vision and mission through good governance. As part of its role, the following matters require the Management Committee 's approval:

- Approve budget for the financial year and monitor expenditure against budget;
- Review and approve financial statements;
- Regularly monitor the progress of the charity's programmes.

Term limit

The term of office of the Committee shall be for a period of two years and members of the Committee shall be eligible for re-election.

The maximum consecutive tenure an individual may serve as President shall be eight years regardless of the number of years as a non-presiding member in the Management Committee.

The Treasurer may not hold office for more than two terms (4 years).
